Admissions/Registration

Students of Military Families: Miami-Dade County Public Schools recognizes the importance of removing barriers to educational success imposed on children of military families. Furthermore, per <u>Florida Statutes 1003.05(3)</u>, enrollment priority is given to students whose parents are on active military duty. The <u>Initial Registration Procedures Handbook</u> provides the guidelines for enrolling students of military families. The <u>Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children</u> is another useful resource. This compact addresses common problems that affect military-connected children as a result of frequent moves and deployments. Transition planning for military families

Every service member's journey is as different as the needs of their child and family. Whether your family's transition means a new school, a new posting, or even an extended deployment, we are here to help you every step of the way. Our team will assist your family with registration and academic planning.
